**F**ilm Festival is a team game in which the participants take on the roles of people from a film studio.

Within a limited amount of time, you need to come up with five film trailers. During the game, you'll see the creative and humorous sides of people come out.

The aim of the game is to test (in a fun way!) your team's ability to work together to come up with solutions to the given tasks.

Everyone's wit and creativity counts.

You'll have an iPad as your camera, making it super-easy to record clips and edit them together.

The game ends with a joint viewing of the trailers. The best in each category receive a Film Festival award.

In this game, the challenges are so exciting that even the most impatient person in the group will stop to analyse them.

The game was designed to foster teamwork and allows everyone to get involved. Some plan strategic moves while others present the solutions in the game space.

The game fosters negotiation skills, as there are situations where players will need to be 'borrowed' from rival teams.

# Robot Wars

*This workshop-style team game is suited to groups with different skills, knowledge and interests.*

The robotics workshop utilises LEGO constructor sets, with a pre-built motorised base at the heart of it all, operated by remote control.

“It was so cool! Nobody on our team is a tech geek, but we ended up being great at building robots anyway. Our development lead said the robot wars were exactly what we needed.”



The aim is to build a working, remote-controlled robot in a given time, and to use it – adopting the best techniques – to win the robot wars. You can add features and accessories to your robot to give it an edge in the competition.

Anyone with previous programming experience will be able to build a detailed, competition-ready robot in the time given, adding more features, additional motors and assemblies, and even writing code.

The robots will be put to the test in two areas: a bug fight and robot-vs-robot battles. These one-minute robot wars are fun and engaging.

*Get your event off to a great start!*



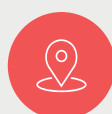

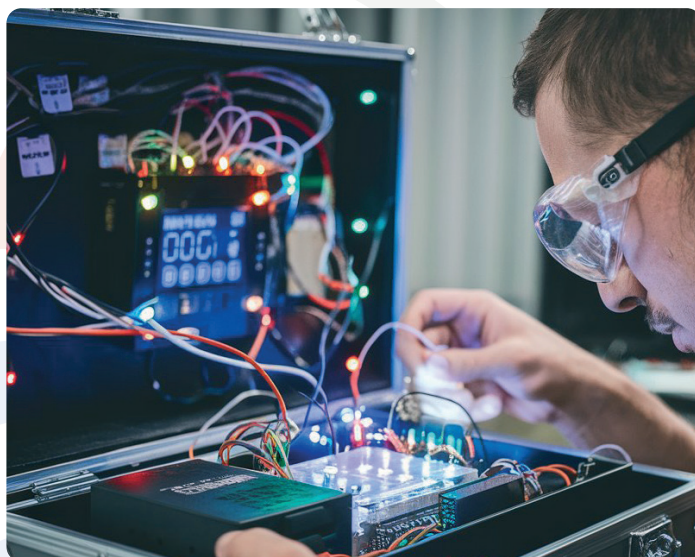

# Save Your Colleagues

*This game is well suited to team training, early on or midway through the day.*

**W**hat do you do if everyone on the team has their hands tied and there's a suitcase with a ticking timer on the table? Everyone has to get free within the time given, and everyone needs to contribute in order for the group to succeed.

To do this, you have to untie your hands in a coordinated way that uses a variety of techniques to help everyone get free with keys and codes.



To get the keys, you have to guess things, open locks and act out different situations. Success is reliant on teamwork and communication.

The game provides a huge amount of input for the trainer to analyse the teamwork and give feedback.

# Where Am I?

Are you ready for a race around the world?*



This is a team game that lets you go globetrotting without stepping aboard a plane or ship. You'll jump from one end of the Earth to the other in mere seconds! Egypt to Mexico without a plane? Pop across to the Taj Mahal? In this game it's a piece of cake!

## How does the game work?

All of the participants are divided up into smaller teams, each of which is given a tablet. On it, the team is presented with a game space in which they have to complete five rounds of varying difficulty.

In each round, the game drops you in a randomly chosen location, sharing clues to it in the form of a video, image or sound file. The team's task is to work out where they are.

*This game is perfect as a bit of fun at an indoor event like a Christmas party or seminar. It can also easily be played as a hybrid game via video link.*



Each team is given a tablet that displays their challenging missions. The aim of the game is to complete the missions and gather clues that provide a mysterious combination of words and numbers. Once you have enough clues, you need to start cracking the code. The clock's ticking, and every second counts! If you don't complete your mission in the time given, the virus will be unleashed on the world.

It's worth noting that there are other agents working on the case, so it's not just a race against time – there's a competitive element, too! Who can come up with the most correct answers? Who can crack the code the fastest? All of these factors come into play in determining which team members have the qualities of true agents.

*The goal is to create a machine that performs this simple task in the most complex way possible.*

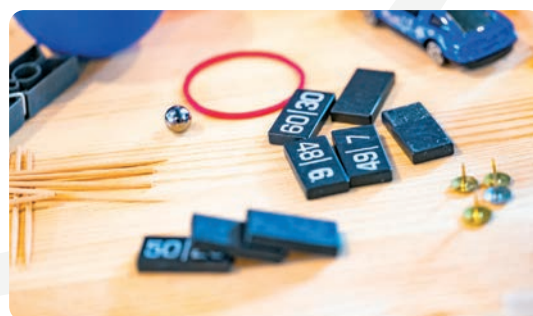

# DIY F1

**D**IY F1 is a big but scalable game that can be used to shore up the concept of your summer retreat and as the running theme throughout. It's a fun team-building exercise for a larger group that involves different roles, planning, building and competition.

The game is made up of four parts:

**AUCTION:** This is the planning part, during which you have to buy parts for your car. The auction lasts for 15–30 minutes. (Don't worry – you pay with pretend money!)

**CONSTRUCTION:** Using the parts you bought in the auction and additional materials from your starter kit, your team builds a stylish, fully drivable car that complies with all the rules. You have to make all of the chassis parts and safety equipment. You're given plenty of time to do all this.

**AUTO SHOW:** Everyone exhibits the cars they've made and gets to see what their competitors have come up with.

**RACE:** The grand finale! Taking place on a marked track, the race follows precise rules, including mandatory driver changes and a limited number of pit stops. This requires real teamwork and tactics, and is fun for everyone involved.

The organisers provide everything you'll need to make the cars: the chassis, building materials, tools, design elements and stickers.

When the game begins, each team has one year's worth of CO<sub>2</sub> in their account which they can start reducing straight away. You'll learn more about the biodiversity around us as you do so.

The aim is to become as carbon-neutral as possible by the end of the game by taking the right steps and making the right decisions. The game will also get you thinking about how much our everyday activities affect the world around us.

Teams have to find the right locations and, following the instructions, stage a photo with a specific theme in each location. Finding the locations and taking the photos is done with a tablet.

Layers are added to the game by secret locations on the map and augmented reality – you might run into a dinosaur or UFO. Chuck Norris, Kim Jong-un and other big names pop up, as well. The more courage, creativity and originality you display, the better your results will be.

Teams that find lots of locations and take lots of pictures have a better chance of winning.

The hunt is followed by a joint viewing of the photos. Everyone will have a laugh, as the inventive compositions usually feature funny faces and peculiar scenes!

The digital images will be a lasting reminder of this fun game for the participants.

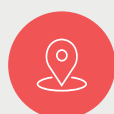

The games are played in teams of 6–10 people. In total, the teams have to complete up to eight different exercises, all of which are based on trust and communication and require them to work together towards a shared goal.

Flexibility, leadership and the ability to use alternative ways of communicating are the keys to success.

As such, the game is well suited to smaller training events and multilingual groups.

# Moneygrubbing

*This fun, fast-paced game is perfect for large and very large events.*

It's designed for smart players with plenty of team spirit. Moneygrubbing requires you to be quick off the mark, in every sense. It's an orienteering game that demands both strategy and planning.

There are four checkpoints with team tasks – fun, classic challenges that depend on you all working together. The aim is to collect as much virtual money as possible as you make your way around the course. Orienteering using a tablet takes planning and strategy, while the team tasks will need everyone to put in an effort. The checkpoints on the course vary in value, with easier ones earning you less money and harder ones garnering you more.

The game can easily be tweaked to match the overarching theme of your event if you add your company's name and logo and prepare questions and tasks based on the kinds of stuff you deal with.

Moneygrubber is flexible: you can have all of the teams start together, or stagger their starts throughout the day.

# Bingo Battle

*How do you like the sound of a no-holds-barred bingo battle with your colleagues?*

*This game is ideal for company events or even for your own birthday party.*

We're not talking normal bingo here, where luck plays a huge role: Bingo Battle is an adventure game in which everyone has an equal chance. But you'll have to get your strategy right and make the most of what you know if you want to solve the puzzles faster than the other teams.

The game uses visual clues that will force you to think outside the box. All of the puzzles are unique and cover a range of topics, including sport, culture and popular science. As such, every participant will get the chance to show off their skills and knowledge.

The game can have more than one aim: while the main objective is to get the highest score and win the grand prize, there are five other smaller prizes up for grabs as well. These can be won by completing certain combinations (rows, columns, the frame, diagonals and the full board) quicker than everyone else. This means that more than one team has a chance of winning.

# Jüri von Kaufmann's Adventures Around Estonia



**J**üri von Kaufmann was a medieval merchant. Originally from Lübeck, he lived in Reval (as Tallinn was formerly known) and travelled a great deal, especially to the other Hanseatic cities in Estonia. He was neither particularly poor nor particularly rich. But he was special: he could see the future. He left us tasks to tackle in order to reveal messages.

The aim of this game is to find Jüri's 'trail of breadcrumbs', solve the puzzles and discover the message he left for the team. On the map, you'll see places where Jüri might have left the tasks.

It doesn't matter what order you follow the trail in, but the more tasks you find, the more chance you'll have of working out Jüri's message. The map also shows the outline of the medieval city wall. You'll be mostly safe inside the walls, but be on your guard outside of them, as there are all sorts of crooks and swindlers about. That said, bigger risks mean bigger rewards...

This is an immersive game in which you'll get to explore both well-known and lesser-known sights and find out some fascinating historical facts.

# The Fax from Head Office

*This game is a great way of enriching a teamwork training day.*

It differs from other games in that there's no element of competition between the players. Instead, it requires them to work together, giving them (and you) the tools needed to foster teamwork in your company.

The tasks that have to be completed are analysed with the person running the game or the trainer.



Resolving situations in a playful way helps to boost the effectiveness of subsequent teamwork.

At the start of the game, the team receives a fax from head office outlining what they have to do. Within the time given, they have to divide up the roles, coordinate their approach and plan the right amount of time to complete the tasks without any additional information or guidance.



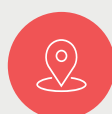

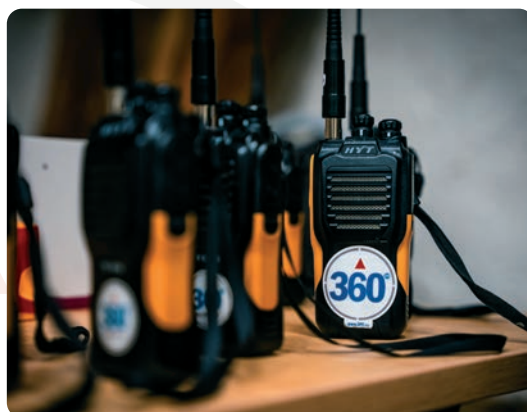

# How to Boost Turnover

*This is an ideal game for large groups. It's well suited to team training sessions, at which our trainer can link your training topics to the situations in the game.*

**T**he game can be used to improve how people work together and to give examples of how the lessons they learn can be applied in the workplace.

There is no competitive element between people or teams in the game: everyone has to work towards a common goal, dealing with unexpected situations in the process and figuring out how to boost



[virtual] turnover by working together. The players are given everything they'll need to solve the tasks: tablets, means of communication, documents, newspapers and more.

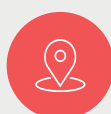
Each team consists of 5-6 people who have to navigate a course according to the given rules, doing a bit of guesswork, answering questions and solving tasks as they go in order to foster cooperation.

“The game went really well. It was a bit confusing at first, but everyone soon realised that working as a team would move them forward faster. Communication was key. There were 110 of us who took part, and we were all really happy with how it went. Given the chance, we'd love to try more of your games – and we'll definitely be recommending this one to others!”

Their ultimate aim is the same: to boost turnover. Exchanging and communicating information quickly, actively and directly, helping teammates and coordinating activities in a coherent way are all important elements of the game.

# No Easy Day

*This game was inspired by special operations and focuses on interaction.*

A team comprises two groups. The first is the HQ group, who monitor a satellite map and guide the strike team by radio to reach a series of checkpoints as quickly as they can.

The second is the aforementioned strike team, who have to trust the instructions they're given and interpret them correctly. Both groups play a vital role in the success of the mission and in leading their team to victory.

During the game, the participants learn how to communicate information that's needed to achieve an objective and how to interpret and use information in order to make the right decisions. The practical exercises they complete will prove useful in everyday communication later on.

The person running the game sets up a proper HQ, with a big screen and all the necessary equipment. Teams have the use of walkie-talkies and GPS devices.

The game ends with teams analysing what they did and sharing their experience with others.

It's suited to groups who want to combine team training with a bit of fun. The more participants there are, the higher the level of difficulty and the greater the excitement.

# The Riddle of Karl Väino

*This game makes a great addition to seminars, team events and summer retreats.*

Legend has it that a locked briefcase was once found in the National Museum with a warning written on it: forcing the briefcase open would destroy its contents. Museum staff confirmed that the latest dating methods identified former Estonian Communist Party leader Karl Väino as the original owner of the briefcase.

Each team is given a copy of it, along with its mysterious contents – which need to be used to solve the riddle of the briefcase. Teams have to make sense of clues, follow tracks, crack codes and complete tasks.

Each team has 6-7 members.

Different tasks are solved at points along the game course, navigating around which is done using an electronic map. Each completed task leads to the next one. The game can be played by anyone, with a time limit adding to the excitement.

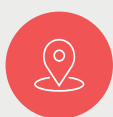
We have 25 briefcases with identical contents, including roubles, a bottle, tools and lots of things you might need during the game.

# The Great Treasure Hunt

*This game is a fun team-building activity for medium-sized and larger groups attending a summer retreat.*

**F**ollow the map, find your way around the course and solve the tasks to weave together the threads of the story. Your aim is to find the much sought-after treasure chest.

Legend has it that a very special treasure chest has yet to be found, and teams have an ancient map and a single clue to help them find it.



To do so, they have to make their way around the course with the map, finding further clues and solving puzzles.

Each one will provide a piece of information that will eventually help the teams find the treasure. In addition to the map and a compass, an old radio also comes into play to decode and crack locks.

The last five minutes of the game are incredibly fast-paced: once all of the teams have returned from the forest, the last, very important clue is given to them, helping them piece together everything they know to reveal the location of the treasure chest.

The team that's quickest to solve the last puzzle and find the treasure chest wins.

It's an adventure game in which you 'mine' actual bitcoins – of which there are plenty for everyone – and includes 12 different team-work exercises.

Mining for Bitcoin has all the key features of a team game: strategizing, navigating and solving tasks.

The smartest team earns the most bitcoins for the right answers, and the team with the most bitcoins in the end wins!

The game is perfect for tailoring questions to the company in question – for instance, to showcase a new concept, brand or objectives.

100 Mõlki is an exciting strategy game that's played using tablets.

The playing field is the surrounding landscape, across which virtual checkpoints are scattered and need to be found.

Teams must aim to answer questions correctly to score exactly 100 points. The game requires quick reactions and strategic thinking.

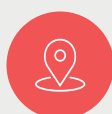

# The World of Sound

This game is well suited to groups from different linguistic and cultural backgrounds, as the tasks don't require any reading or speaking – they only involve sounds.

Legend has it that radio scanners were unearthed at Glehn Castle which allow you to hear sounds from the past. Conspiracy theorists are said to have tried (and failed) to unravel the mystery of this world of sound, but it remains unsolved to this day.

This fun and simple team game involves navigating by ear. For added excitement, it can be played in the dark – that way, the sounds are sure to come across a bit differently! Moving at a leisurely pace, the teams cover 2–3 km in the course of the game.

Can your team solve the sound puzzles?

The most fun with this game is often had during the recap, when we listen to all the sounds and explain what they are.

The use of sounds made this quite an unusual game, because it was all about perception. That led to quite a bit of discussion among our team. The sun setting added to the excitement, since only the strength of the sounds we were hearing told us whether we were on the right track. It's a game I'd definitely play with my friends.

# Disc Golf

*Disc golf is perfect for larger events, since it gives the participants the chance to stretch their legs while enjoying the company of their fellow team members.*



We provide a course with eight baskets, a variety of discs and someone to run the game.

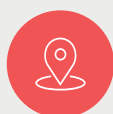


Equipment for playing during hours of darkness (LED headlamps, glow-in-the-dark discs and illuminated baskets) can also be provided.

find in the cottage suggests that the owner is up to some very sinister things. Trapped, the team must uncover clues, solve riddles and tasks and find the key if they are to escape – and they only have 30 minutes.

# Bogshoeing and snowshoeing

**W**e run bogshoe and snowshoe hikes all year round, and they're an affordable adventure for all. We go at a relaxed pace, with our guide telling you all about your surroundings.

In **spring**, it's lovely to see nature waking from its winter slumber in Estonia's bogs. This is when you'll hear the most birdsong here, as birds nest on the edges of the inky pools.

In **summer**, the star attraction on bogshoe hikes is the stunning mornings with their dew-covered cobwebs – and the chance to take a dip in one of the bog pools.

In **autumn**, Estonia's bogs will enchant you for their colourfulness and their cranberries. This is the time of year when the bogs are at their kaleidoscopic best.

In **winter**, you'll be bowled over by the beauty of the snowy landscape, and intrigued by the animal tracks you come across. In the right conditions, you can even go tobogganing and ice-skating.



Wearing bogshoes or snowshoes, you can get to places you otherwise wouldn't reach on foot. They protect the fragile soil of the bog and make it easier to get about on the soft ground.

*(Note that bogshoeing is not allowed in spring, when we organise ordinary hikes on the boardwalks instead.)*

# Ordinary hikes

We organise a range of hikes, be they on trails of our choice or on one we help you design where you are. One of our favourite spots is the Paljassaare peninsula, with all of its history and its varied landscape. It's an important site for nesting and migrating birds and can be used for a variety of hikes. Moreover, it's not that far from the centre of Tallinn!

Long closed off, the peninsula attracts lots of walkers and cyclists, and its landscape and history make it a popular destination in the area. One section of the site even forms part of the Natura 2000 network.



The hike follows the main roads through the peninsula, but we also go off-road wherever there's something worth seeing.

Along the way we talk about:

- the interesting sounds we can hear around us;
- old military-zone buildings like the White Tower; and
- the former border guard towers and storage facilities for mines and torpedoes.

We also visit both the railway embankment and coastal defence barracks no. 12 of the Peter the Great Sea Fortress built in 1915, the surviving parts of which are now under heritage protection.

The hike lasts for around three hours, during which we cover approx. 8 km, although a shorter hike of 6.5 km is also available.

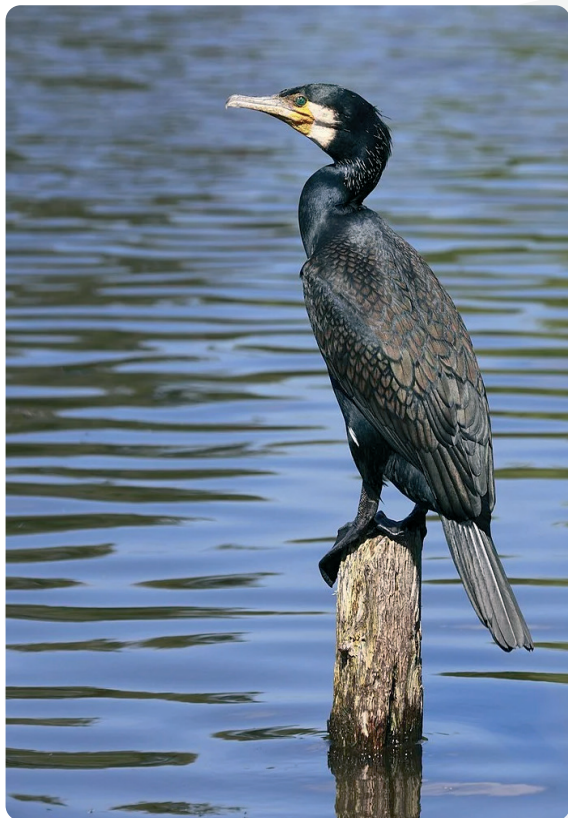

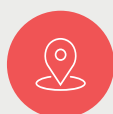

If you'd rather go sledding on your own, we offer equipment rental as well.

Our canoes comfortably accommodate two people, but can seat three if needed. They're ideal for families as well: up to two children can be placed on the middle seat, depending on their age, with one parent taking charge of the rowing while the other looks after the kids.

Before the hike, our guides provide clear and understandable instructions so that everyone will feel safe and comfortable on the water. They also stay with the group throughout, assisting and sharing skills as situations arise, and guiding all of the canoes through and around obstacles in the water.

**T**he training is structured like a classic team-building exercise:

- 1.** A plan is drawn up, and issues affecting the teams are discussed (e.g. communication, trust, taking responsibility and different people's needs).
- 2.** A practical team game is then conducted and various situations are resolved. The best suited games are 'The Fax from Head Office' (pg 22), 'How to Boost Turnover' (pg 23), 'No Easy Day' (pg 24) and 'Save Your Colleagues' (pg 9). The training can also be combined with a hike.
- 3.** What happened in the game is then analysed with the trainer. Similar situations are compared so as to make more effective connections for everyday work.
- 4.** Conclusions are drawn regarding what could be done differently and what steps could be taken to improve cooperation within the team. Specific agreements are made that can be implemented from the very next working day.





On shorter courses, less time is spent discussing and analysing things. A full day of training allows for more in-depth discussion, more time for the participants to talk and more time to come up with agreements.
